

Types of Volunteer 4-H Leaders

Organizational 4-H Leader

- ❑ Overall 4-H Leader of your club
- ❑ Overall communicator between the club, parents and the 4-H Office
- ❑ Manager/Organizer of your 4-H club
- ❑ Acts as a positive Role Model to the members of your 4-H Club



Project 4-H Leader

- ❑ “The Project Leader is a teacher”
- ❑ Organizes and conducts specific projects
- ❑ Can serve as an Organizational Leader while serving as a project leader (generally this occurs in small club situations)
- ❑ Provide guidance & support to 4-H Members on their projects
- ❑ Acts as a positive Role Model to the members of your 4-H Club

Activity or Event 4-H Leader

- ❑ “This leader advises & assists 4-H members in planning & working together on the activities & events they choose.”
- ❑ Acts as a positive Role Model to the members of your 4-H Club

Resource 4-H Leader

- ❑ Works with a 4-H club on a short-term basis or as-needed basis
Specified time period
- ❑ Helps with an activity, event &/or project
- ❑ Have expertise in areas that other 4-H Leaders in the club may not have
- ❑ Acts as a positive Role Model to the members of your 4-H Club

Methods in which 4-H is offered

Community-Based 4-H Clubs:

- ❑ 5 members or more ages 5-18
- ❑ Generally lead by Volunteer 4-H Leaders
- ❑ Meetings held outside of school hours
- ❑ Generally focused on 1-5 specific 4-H projects

After-School 4-H Programs:

- ❑ Can be a Community-Based 4-H Club or a Special Interest 4-H Program format
- ❑ Program meets at a school during non-school hours
- ❑ Led by a Volunteer 4-H Leader or paid staff member

4-H School Enrichment :

- ❑ 4-H Curriculum and/or projects are provided by the 4-H Program
- ❑ 4-H Curriculum and/or projects are utilized by teachers in classroom setting
- ❑ 4-H Agents will train teachers on how to use the curriculum/program
- ❑ Ages based on curriculum and program type

Special Interest 4-H Programs :

- ❑ Generally a short-term project with a specified time frame
- ❑ Led by volunteer 4-H Leaders
